

Beginning May 1, COTF will be a host site for the City of Ventura's SAFE SLEEP program.

SAFE SLEEP provides a safe place for people that must sleep in their cars to park at night.

Participants work with a social worker toward permanent housing. Salvation Army manages the program and provides case managers.

A maximum of five participants will be hosted by Church of the Foothills.

Additional Donation Opportunities at COTF Monthly Drive-Thrus

The O&B Board resumed collection of gently used adult clothing items last month. Items will now be donated to Project Understanding, Ventura Homeless Prevention (Family 2 Family), and other agencies that serve our homeless population. They are especially in need of gently used women's and men's clothing, maternity clothing, tennis shoes, socks, jackets and blankets.

We are also happy to report that the Outreach Board will partner with the UU church's "Move-In" program – a program designed for those who are homeless and transitioning to more permanent housing. Boxes are made up by UU volunteers for kitchen, bed/bath and office supplies to have ready for these new home dwellers. **Starting at our May 20**th **drive, we will also be collecting gently used bed and bath linens, workable small kitchen appliances or kitchenware, and general office supplies (paper, pencils, pens, etc.).** You do not need to make up a box of items (UU volunteers will do this) – just general donations are fine. Only request - bed linens labeled or tagged as to bed size (i.e., twin, full, queen or king).

We continue to collect non-perishable foods, fresh produce and hygiene products for Project Understanding's Food Pantry. In addition, any gently used books are welcome for Friends of the Library's book sales in support of our public libraries.
